WHO

Usage: used to ask the person who did the action.

Examples:

- . Who is the Present of Brazil?
- Who will be the winner?

WHAT

Usage: used to ask for information.

Examples:

- · What does this sentence mean?
- What dress are you wearing tonight?

WHEN

Usage: used to ask the time of an event/action.

Examples:

- When can I see you again?
- When is the next World Сաр?

WHERE

Usage: used to ask for the location.

Examples:

- Where were the keys?
- Where do you live?





Usage: used to ask for a reason/cause.

Examples:

- Why did you break the glass?
- Why haven't you called?



- The answers for **simple questions** (yes/no questions) in English are "Yes,""No," or "I don't know".
- The answers for **information questions** are varied, because they are used to ask about specific kinds of information.
- **Information questions** are also called "Wh-" questions,
- because many of the words that are used to ask this
- type of question begin with Wh-.




STRUCTURE OF THE INFORMATION QUESTIONS.

- Wh-words + to be verb + subject + verb + ing+....? (was/were)
 - Where was she going to last night?
 - What were you doing two hours ago?
 - Who was dancing at the party?
 - (when we use "who" we usually don't use subject in the question because we don't know the subject)

Form of Past Continuous Tense: Wh-Question

Question word	"BE" +	Subject +	main verb (V+ing) +	modifier ?
Who	was	I	talking	to when the phone rang?
Where	were	you, we, they	watching	World's Cup last night?
What	was	he, she, it	doing	at 11 o'clock last night?



STRUCTURE OF THE SIMPLE PAST QUESTIONS.

- Wh- questions + did + subject + verb (simple) +.....?
- Where did she go to last night?
- What did you do two hours ago?
- Who danced at the party?

(When we use "who" in simple past questions the structure is different:

Who + verb (in the simple past form) +?)



COMPARISON

- What were they doing at the party?
- What did they do at the party?

- Where were you going last night?
- Where did you go last night?

- When was she singing?
- When did she sing?



(It was a traditional Ecuadorian song.)

Reminder

The simple past tense expresses a completed, not continuing, past action.

What did you eat for dinner yesterday?




- **Heavy rain** = a lot of rain

- **Weather forecast**: to say what the weather will be





